

The demand for robotic surgery has never been stronger given the growing desire for accurate, safe and minimally invasive medical procedures. Technology is evolving to meet that need, driving growing opportunities for investors.



- As the chart demonstrates, the market for robotic surgery is expected to nearly double from 2019 to 2030. The most significant driver of this strong growth is better patient outcomes. There is evidence that robotic surgeries are safer and more effective, with higher precision and minimal incision, reducing blood loss and decreasing the chance of infection, producing faster recovery times, shorter hospital stays and lower levels of readmission.
- Robotically assisted surgeries feature a doctor controlling a computer-aided robot that has
 surgical instruments mounted on its arms. These procedures have grown rapidly with 10 million
 procedures having been performed cumulatively on Intuitive Surgical's robotic surgery system
 da Vinci, for example. According to Alger, fewer than 5% of surgeries globally are performed
 robotically, leaving the potential for strong growth.
- We believe, investors can gain exposure to this growing area of health care by investing in robotic surgical platforms, medical device manufacturers and chip makers.
