Dividend Leaders generate high dividend yields

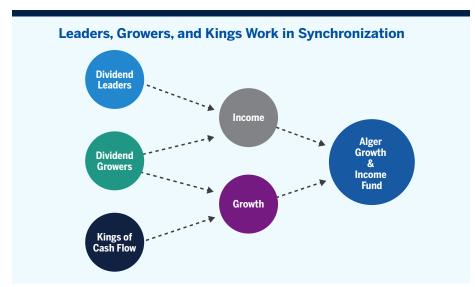
Dividend Growers have a history of strong and consistent dividend growth

Alpha is the difference between a portfolio's return and its benchmark's return after adjusting for the level of risk taken, as measured by beta. A higher alpha ranking suggests that a portfolio has delivered a greater return given the risk taken. **Information Ratio** compares returns to an index in the context of a fund's level of risk. A high information ratio indicates "efficient" use of risk by a manager. Sharpe Ratio measures risk-adjusted performance by dividing returns in excess of the "risk-free" rate by standard deviation of the portfolio's excess returns over the same time period. A higher Sharpe Ratio ranking means that a portfolio has delivered higher return per unit of risk. Overall Capture Ratio is the ratio of the Upside Capture Ratio to the Down side Capture Ratio. The Upside Capture Ratio and Downside Capture Ratio measure a portfolio's performance in up and down markets, respectively, relative to the benchmark. They are calculated by taking the portfolio's upside (or downside) return and dividing it by the benchmark's upside (or downside) return. A down-market is defined as those time periods in which market return is less than 0.
